Half Term Learning	<p>This half term we will continue to study World War Two and the legacy left behind. We will look more closely at the impact of this significant historical event on people and places within our locality. Our geography work will involve learning how to interpret and use scales drawings. In art and music, we will look at the work of well-known artists, designers and musicians and consider how their work during and after WW2 reflected the society at that time. Our computing work will look closely at how to make use of the Internet, including safe use, reporting concerns and verifying information. In French the topic is 'Les Quatre Saisons' (The four seasons). Children will be learning to describe the months and seasons. The focus will be on learning a range of adjectives and opinion phrases. In science, we will begin to learn about electricity and learn how to build circuits including buzzers and switches.</p>
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Through our RE lessons our learning will be:	<p>Jesus the Messiah</p> <p>This topic gives the children a deepening understanding of Jesus and allows them to reflect on what they believe about their faith. They will understand that Jesus is the Messiah and will learn about the final journey that Jesus made to Jerusalem. In addition to this, they will know about, and reflect upon the events of Holy Week and will deepen their understanding of the Resurrection.</p>
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	English	Maths
This half term our learning will be:	<p>In English we will be looking at letter writing, narrative writing and arguments. We will be using example texts to help us before innovating and inventing our own versions. The writing objectives we will cover will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • using dialogue to convey character • cohesion – including adverbials, conjunctions, pronouns and repetition • sentence structures and variation • editing and proofreading • correct text formation, layout and features <p>We will also be revising grammar terms</p>	<p>Our maths work this term will continue to be centred on our scheme 'Power Maths'. Our topics this term will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • algebra • converting units of measurement • volume, area & perimeter • ratio • statistics <p>We will also continue to practise our arithmetic skills and revise other areas of maths.</p>
