This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

A summary of our learning for this half term:

During this half term our History unit is "Invaders and Settlers" and we will study when and why the Anglo Saxons settled in Britain and the impact of this. The children will use evidence to ask questions and find answers to questions about this period of time.

In Science, the topic is "Electricity." The children will create and experiment with electrical circuits and investigate whether certain materials are conductors or insulators of electricity. In Art, the children will learn to mix and match paint colours, use different types of lead pencil, pastels, charcoal and pen types to make a variety of lines with varying thicknesses and build up layers. This will culminate in pieces of art work depicting a range of Anglo-Saxon artefacts.

In Design and Technology, the children will follow a recipe, to bake Anglo-Saxon bread and design their own suitable packaging.

During computing, the children will practise their times tables using TTRS as well as using Purple Mash for coding and writing a newspaper article.

In Geography we will use and develop our map and atlas skills, as well as using globes and digital/computer mapping to locate the countries that the Anglo-Saxons came from and describe their features.

In PE, we will build up our stamina through regular use of the Golden Mile and will create a gymnastic sequence.

In French the focus is L'argent de Poche (pocket money).

In Music, we will express our opinions about music from the past using Anglo-Saxon music.

The children will write a character and setting description using powerful vocabulary, similes, fronted adverbials and prepositional phrases. For Non-fiction, we will be focusing on writing non-chronological reports. Our Guided reading book is the BFG by Roald Dahl.
