This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

<p>A summary of our learning for this half term:</p>	<p>Our Geography and History work this half term will be based around Ancient Egypt. We will be learning to place events, people and changes into correct time periods and examining artefacts to see what they can show us about history. We will also be locating continents and countries as well as other geographical features such as the Equator and Tropics.</p> <p>In Art we will be replicating images by well known artists using pastels and charcoal. We will be drawing animals in fine detail.</p> <p>In Design and technology, we will follow a recipe to make a savoury dish and estimate ingredients.</p> <p>In PE we will be learning how to play hockey as well as choosing our own dance steps and movements and then developing them into a routine.</p> <p>In Computing our theme for the half term will be coding where we will look at writing algorithms, solving problems when writing programs and using a variety of software to achieve specific goals.</p> <p>In Music we will compare pieces by thinking about texture, structure, timbre and dynamics by listening to different pieces of music. We will also begin to develop our singing skills again and enjoy singing together as a class.</p> <p>In French our topic is called OÙ Habites-Tu? Where do you live? We will be talking about where we live, places in town, and map reading.</p> <p>Our RHSE Module One is called Created and Loved by God and explores the individual. Rooted in the teaching that we are made in the image and likeness of God, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships.</p>

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<p>Through our RE lessons this term the pupils will study the following:</p>	<p>The Kingdom of God</p> <p>This topic is designed to develop the children's knowledge and understanding God's Kingdom. The children will learn that everyone is invited into the Kingdom of God; they will consider how to share this good news with others and reflect upon this.</p>
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	English	Maths
These are the main learning objectives that will be taught during this term:	<p>Our fiction theme for English is based on an extract from The Summoner, from which we will practise writing suspense openings. We will be developing the key skills of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ambitious vocabulary • Figurative language • Varying sentence lengths for effect • Paragraphing • Expanded noun phrases • Repetition for effect <p>In addition to the above, we will focus on revising fundamental writing skills such as basic sentence punctuation, spelling and handwriting in order for the children to develop confidence with their writing.</p>	<p>We will start the first two weeks on the Unit of Measures from Year 5, before moving onto the year 6 curriculum.</p> <p>The main theme throughout this term will be to secure the pupils' understanding of place value and encouraging the children to rapidly recall expected maths facts: both addition/subtraction and multiplication/division; the use of efficient written methods within the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division).</p> <p>However, it will be their ability to apply these skills, and to explain reasoning, that will improve their mathematical understanding the most.</p> <p>Also:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Using the 4 operations • Number sequences • Rounding <p>There will be some specific time devoted to the rehearsal of key facts and revision of key arithmetic skills.</p>
