This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

A summary of our learning for this half term:

During this half term we will be finding out about the history of toys and how they have changed over time. We will focus on comparing toys from when our parents and grandparents were young to the toys we play with now. We will be handling and looking at toys from the past and will ask and answer questions using both photographs and artefacts. The theme of toys will extend into our D&T lessons where we will be making our own soft toys using a running stitch. In art we will explore primary and secondary colours through colour mixing. We will learn how to hold a brush properly, make colour wheels and will mix our own colours to make pop art in the style of Andy Warhol. In computing we will be learning to log in to Purple Mash and will begin to explore grouping and sorting using 2DIY. We will talk about how to keep our password safe. We begin Year 1 with a Real PE unit, in which we will learn to balance on one leg, sidestep, hop, skip and gallop.

Through our RE lessons this term the pupils will study the following:

In our RE work we will be looking at God's Great Plan and the creation story. We will look at the wonders of our world and will explore our role in looking after our world. We will also look at the story of Noah's Ark and the significance of the rainbow as a sign of God's promise.

These are the main learning objectives that will be taught during this term:

We will earn new vocabulary through our history work on Toys. We will develop reading skills and our knowledge of high frequency words. We will learn to recognise and spell high frequency words. We will begin to use capital letters for the word I, their own name and at the beginning of a sentence. We will use phonic knowledge to help spell and read new words.

We will use stories to write labels and lists and write about stories with

We will learn to be able to read, write and order numbers to at least 20 and place numbers on a number track. When given a number, we will be able to identify one more and one less. We will learn to read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (–) and equals (=) signs.

Maths

We will relate addition to counting on and use subtraction as takeaway and use the related vocabulary. We will compare and order numbers and use the equals sign.
