This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

A summary of our learning for this second half term:

During this half term Class 18 will be continuing to study the Science unit of Life Cycles and our History/Geography unit will continue to be based around 'Our Local Area'. In science, the children will be describing and comparing the life cycles of mammals, insects and amphibians; describing the life process of reproduction in some living things and describing the changes as humans develop to old age. In History/Geography, we will continue to study our local area in terms of its significant history and geographical location. In computing this half term, the children will learn about spreadsheets. We will be focusing on using formulas in spreadsheets, using the 'how many count tool', using text variables to perform calculations and using a spreadsheet to plan an event. During P.E. we will learn about orienteering. The children will plan a simple orienteering trial for others to complete; read a wide variety of map symbols and use a compass when following a given route. They will also plan ideas of how to solve a problem before attempting it. In Music the children will compose melodic and rhythmic phrases and perform their own compositions from memory. They will reflect on their own composition's dynamics, tempo and timbre. They will begin to explore reasons for composers' tempo choices. During Art the children will create layers of paint to add detail to background colours. They will create different effects with paint. As part of Design and Technology work they will learn about what makes a good product and how to assess the effectiveness of products designed by others. We will also focus on a local business to inspire our own designs and process.

Through our RE lessons this term the pupils will study the following:

God's Covenants

The children will learn about the meaning of covenant and reflect on God's covenant with Noah. Furthermore, they will learn about the covenant God made with Abraham, Moses and the Israelites. They will understand that God guides and challenges His people. The children will become aware of our need to grow in faith and trust in God. They will also discover that God sent prophets to remind His people of His covenant. Finally, we will learn that God makes a New Covenant with us. We will reflect on our part in this covenant.

My Happy Mind & Wellbeing sessions focus on:

We will begin with the module '**Meet Your Brain**' - this module is focused on giving children a foundational knowledge of the brain and teaching them how they can look after their minds to be at their very best. We will then move onto '**Celebrate**' - this module is focused on introducing the evidence based theory that we all have different character strengths and that by understanding what they are and then using them as much as possible, we can be at our best!

	English	Maths
These are the main learning objectives that will be taught during this term:	<p><u>Descriptive Writing</u> We will be continuing to use our Talk for Writing structure to focus on description this half term. We will be learning a description off by heart before unpicking the text, learning how to use the features in our own descriptive writing based on a creature from the book Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them. The skills we will focus on will include vocabulary, sentence structure and relative clauses.</p> <p><u>Instructional Writing</u> For the next part of this term we will turn to non-fiction writing, specifically how to successfully create a set of instructions to follow. As always when following Talk for Writing, we will orally rehearse a set of instructions to embed the structure and features of instructional writing. We will focus on layout features as well as grammatical features this half term, thinking about how the layout of a text is important in this type of writing. In Shared reading lessons we will continue reading ‘The boy at the back of the class’ before moving on to focusing on the text Room 13 by Robert Swindells.</p>	<p><u>Statistics</u> At the start of this half term the children will be first learning about reading information in tables and charts. This will also include reading timetables and answering questions. They will then learn to read and interpret line graphs. Finally, they will draw their own line graphs with accuracy.</p> <p><u>Multiplication and Division</u> In the second part of this half term the children will be looking at understanding and using multiples, factors and prime numbers. Then they will learn to Multiply and divide mentally, including by 10, 100 and 1000. Then they will learn to recognise and use square and cube numbers and their notation.</p> <p><u>Area and perimeter</u> Before Christmas the children will find the perimeter of composite rectilinear shapes and calculate, compare and estimate area.</p>
