This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

A summary of our learning for this second half term:

We will continue to explore Ancient Egypt in our History and Geography work this half term and will examine the controversy surrounding the Egyptian Queen 'Cleopatra'. We will analyse historical sources of evidence and will suggest reasons for conflicting accounts. We will create our own accurate maps of Egypt using both photographs and measurements and will learn how to both read and write a 6-figure grid reference.

In Art we will replicate images by well known artists and will use pencil to control perception of distance.

We will develop an understanding of simple units of measure when cooking in Design and Technology and will know how to maintain a healthy lifestyle through our food choices.

In P.E we will be learning more about Orienteering and Gymnastics. We will be learning how to follow a map using symbols and in gymnastics we will be sequencing a range of movements. In Computing we will continue with our work on coding, then we will learn how to create and interrogate a spreadsheet and will analyse and evaluate information and data within them.

We will learn what a soundscape is in our Music lessons and will then go on to compose our own. We will resume our French topic 'Où Habites-Tu?' (Where do you live?) and will continue to develop our speaking and listening skills, talking about where we live and some of the places within our town.

Our RHSE Module One is called Created and Loved by God and explores the individual. Rooted in the teaching that we are made in the image and likeness of God, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships.

Through our RE lessons this term the pupils will study the following:

Justice

Throughout this unit we will be exploring the idea of 'Justice'. We will begin by reflecting on our own ideas about Justice and will develop an understanding of how we are called to work for it. We will learn about some of the people who have worked for Justice — including Oscar Romero and Martin Luther King - and will reflect on what we can learn from them.

My Happy Mind & Wellbeing sessions focus on:

In these lessons we will learn about the different parts of the brain and how to notice when it working well vs. when it is stressed. We'll then explore the situations that cause our brain to move into a stress response or, flight, fight, freeze. We will use Happy Breathing as a tool we can draw on in these situations. We will look at our character strengths and think about how these strengths can help us thrive in the future.
