This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

A summary of our learning for this half term:

During this half term Class 16 will be learning all about the Kingdom of Benin through their History and Geography work. The children will be able to locate Benin using maps and atlases. They will understand the significance of this time in history, identify key figures from this time period, present this time in history on a timeline and understand where this fits within the bigger picture. We will look into and take inspiration from the culture from this time and use this in our own work. For our Science unit, we will begin by focusing on 'forces' - This module builds on these ideas and develops an understanding of how forces including gravitational attraction and drag forces – friction, air resistance, water resistance, and up thrust in water – affect movement. Children learn how mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect, and they use this knowledge in different investigations. In our unit based on mixtures and materials, the children will further develop their knowledge and understanding of materials, achieving an in-depth knowledge of the properties of certain materials and how and why those specific properties make them suitable for particular uses. We will also develop their conceptual knowledge and understanding of how different mixtures of solids and liquids might be separated. They learn that certain solids dissolve while others do not, and how these dissolved solids might be retrieved from a mixture.

In **computing** we will cover two units – game creator and 3D modelling. Our work based on this will focus on creating a game suitable for children of Year 5 age to play. In **PE**, we will look at a range of Athletics events, as well as developing our batting and fielding skills in Rounders.

In **French** the topic for the Summer Term is 'Vive le sport!'. The children will be learning to name a variety of sports in French. The focus will be on giving opinions about sports and talking about when and how often you do sport. For **Art and Design** we will be focusing on sculptures, linking to our work based on the Kingdom of Benin. Lastly, our **music** work will based on Charanga. Where the children will be learning to compose and perform
