This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

<p>A summary of our learning for this half term:</p>	<p>During this half term, Year 6 will be learning about black history. We will research the history of the slave trade and look at how historical events surrounding black lives have triggered events leading to the recent black lives matter agenda. We will also explore some of the arts, music and literature linked to black history, and celebrate significant achievement.</p> <p>In Computing, our work will focus on spreadsheets where the children will explore probability, use spreadsheets in real-life situations and to use a spreadsheet to plan pocket money spending.</p> <p>In PE, we will look at a range of Athletics events, as well as developing our batting and fielding skills in Rounders. We will also continue to develop our orienteering skills.</p> <p>Our Music work will link to black history and we will find similarities and differences between different composers and musicians.</p> <p>In science, we will complete our work on electricity. This will include interpreting and drawing circuit diagrams. We will also begin to explore the themes on evolution and inheritance.</p> <p>In French, the theme for this term's topic will be 'A trip to Paris'. They will be continuing to plan a virtual trip to Paris and completing their Art Work based on Ben Heine. The focus will be using the simple future tense to plan an itinerary.</p> <p>Our Artwork will be based on an African artist, Ndbele, where vivid colours are used to create striking effects. We will also refine our sketching skills to be able to record observational drawings in minute detail.</p>

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<p>Through our RE lessons this term the pupils will study the following:</p>	<p><u>The Transforming Spirit</u></p> <p>In this topic the children will learn that the apostles of Jesus were ordinary people who answered the call to follow Jesus. We will reflect on their own calling to be a follower of Jesus. We will know how the apostles changed when they received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and reflect on how they can be changed. The children will know something about how the early Christian community lived and learn that the life of the first apostles was not easy.</p>
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<p>My Happy Mind & Wellbeing</p>	<p><u>Engage</u></p> <p>During this module the children will learn about how setting goals will help them in their upcoming transition to high school. We will learn about how focusing on our strengths,</p>
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sessions	having positive relationships and showing gratitude can all help us to feel good, and in turn this can help us to achieve more.
Ten:Ten Relationship and Health Education (RHE)	<u>Created to live in Community</u> In this module we will explore the individual's relationship with the wider world. We will explore how human beings are relational by nature and are called to love others in the wider community through service, through dialogue, and through working for the COMMON GOOD.

	English	Maths
This half term our learning will be:	<p>In English we will build on our narrative writing skills using the novel 'Journey to Jo'burg' as a stimulus. This novel will support our work on black history. It is set in South Africa and includes the theme of apartheid.</p> <p>Our writing skills will focus on developing dialogue to advance the action or portray character and building cohesion to avoid confusing the reader.</p> <p>We will also work on information writing, and ensuring our writing has a clear purpose and audience.</p>	<p>Our maths work this term will continue to be centred on our scheme 'Power Maths'. Our topics this term will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Geometry • Angles • Statistics • Problem Solving <p>We will be consolidating learning from last term as well as introducing some real life situations for the children to practise using Maths in their every-day lives.</p>
