This curriculum information will help you to help and support your child's learning this term. The Curriculum Map shows the main areas of learning that your child will undertake during this term.

A summary of our learning for this half term:

During this half term Class 6 will be learning about changes across the Seasons. In Science and Geography, we will observe changes across the four seasons and describe the weather patterns. We will conduct an experiment to see how the weather changes during one school week. We will also identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants. We will name some common wild and garden plants from a walk around our school grounds. In our Art sessions we will know how to create a collage in the style of Eric Carle and to know how to mix materials to create texture, so that we can produce our Art work. In Computing, we will create and change simple animations. Collect and store data about the weather and use digital cameras to create edit and print images. In Music, we will learn a new song and accompany it with a dance. In PE, we will move on to athletics including running, jumping, throwing and catching. We will participate in team games.

<u>Theme</u> Resurrection - The children will explore the events following the death of Jesus including Jesus's appearance to his friends and to "Doubting Thomas."

Unit/Module 4 - Relate.

The children will learn the importance of being able to relate or get along with others in order to have positive relationships. It uses the character strengths lens to illustrate the need to be able to see other perspectives in order to build relationships. Through lots of examples and discussion, the children learn about two key skills that will serve them well in relationship building: Active listening and Stop, Understand Consider. This is all about taking the time to pause, and think about what someone else's point of view might be and why, before taking action.

Ten:Ten Realtionship and Health Education (RHE)

Created to Live in Community explores our relationship with the wider world. Here we explore how human beings are relational by nature and are called to love others in the wider community through service, through dialogue and through working for the common good.
