History. Rule of Law/ Mutual respect/Tolerance

British history

Why did the Romans invade and settle in Britain? /What was important to ancient Egyptians? We learn about other civilisations which may be different to ours and we learn to respect their beliefs, discoveries and inventions. We learn about the importance that these civilisations have for our own civilisations today.

Geography Rule of Law

Who lives in Antarctica? – learning about the Antarctic treaty which allows all nations to research the Antarctic in a safe space. We know that we can express our opinions about issues around the world in a safe space where will be listened to.

English Mutual Respect/ Rule of Law/Democracy

Weekly reading/spellings/tables

Children learn to work together co-operatively in many lessons and listen to each other's opinions whilst working in groups. Hot seating of characters in Hansel and Gretel Unit, also solving a moral dilemma in the Wishing Fish story.

Science Respect/Rule of Law

Learning about the basic requirements and rules to care for a plants and animals including ourselves. How to respect the environment. Performing simple tests while working as a team and safe handling of equipment. Discussing the basic needs of all plants and animals to survive, including ourselves as humans. Learning that every living creature has the right to these things in order to survive.

Year 3

Design and Technology/Art Individual Liberty/ Mutual Respect/ Tolerance

Learning about artists from around the world and learning to value everyone's contribution to the art world. Learning to critique our own and others' work constructively and working cooperatively during our collaborative pieces.

Safeguarding Individual Liberty/ Mutual Respect/ Tolerance

Anti Bullying week, Mental Health awareness and Internet safety, covered in RHE and many other areas of the curriculum as evidenced above.

Computing Democracy/Mutual Respect/Individual Liberty/ Rule of law

Online Safety – using technology safely & respectfully, following rules. Children learn that they have the right to be safe online. They are also taught the importance of keeping personal information and passwords safe and that anything on the internet is there forever so not to use hurtful or derogatory language online.

PE Respect/Tolerance

Outdoor Adventure Activities—communication & tactics. Working as a team and helping those who are not as 'sporty' as ourselves. Also safe use of sports equipment is taught and as well as safe use of sports areas ensuring the safety of ourselves and others.
